Eligibility Criteria for Small Business Grants

- 1. Business Status
 - a. **Legally Registered**: The business must be officially registered with the appropriate government authorities, ensuring it operates within legal frameworks.
 - Dperational Period: Demonstrate stability and a track record of business activities (existing-more than 2+ years, new business-require business plan)

2. Small Business Definition

a. Revenue and Employment: To qualify as a small business, they must have fewer than 25 full-time employees and generate less than \$1 million in annual revenue.

3. Tax Compliance

- a. **Good Standing:** The business must have its taxes in good standing, with no outstanding tax amounts or liens.
- b. **Reporting:** Grant recipients must report the grant funds for tax purposes, ensuring transparency and accountability in how the funds are used.

4. Ownership

- **a. Majority Ownership:** The business owner must hold the majority ownership stake and be the primary decision-maker.
- b. **Business Structure:** Must be for profit. Can be privately-owned corporations, partnerships, or sole proprietorships, covering a range of common business structures.

5. Location

a. **Geographic Requirement:** The business's headquarters must be based in Dallas County to qualify.

6. Purpose of Funds

- a. **Impact Statement:** Applicants may need to provide an impact statement detailing how the grant will benefit their business and the community.
- b. **Marketing Authorization:** Grant recipients will need to authorize the use of their business in marketing efforts by the grantor.
- c. Able to demonstrate need under four categories

Scoring Process for Small Business Grants

- 1. Business Plan Quality- 5 points
 - ^{a.} A well-detailed and compelling business plan is crucial. It should outline the business's goals, strategies, and financial projections.

2. Financial Health-10 points

^{a.} Up-to-date bookkeeping and financial statements are essential. The business's financial health and stability are often evaluated.

3. Impact and Feasibility- 20 points

a. The potential impact of the grant on the business and its feasibility of achieving the proposed outcomes are assessed.

4. Innovation and Uniqueness- 10 points

^{a.} Grants often favor businesses that demonstrate innovation and unique approaches within their industry.

5. Community and Social Impact

^{a.} Some grants prioritize businesses that contribute positively to their community or have a significant social impact.

6. Compliance with Grant Requirements

^{a.} Strict adherence to the grant application guidelines and requirements is necessary. Missing or incorrect information can lead to disqualification.

7. Extra +1 bonus

- a. Community investment into Alliance
- b. Targeted small business
